Instead, we will be asking MUN advisors to assign these placements to the most experienced and passionate students.

External Chair Applications:

We would like to invite students to apply as foreign chairs for the PANAMUN conference. To apply, please complete the <u>application form</u>. We will be accepting applications on a <u>rolling basis</u>, meaning that the earlier the application is sent, the higher chance the student has of getting the role. However, the final deadline will be **July 29th at 11:59 pm EST**.

School Delegation Fee: 260.00 USD

• International Individual Delegate Fee: 100.00 USD

MUN Director/Advisor Fee: 100.00 USD

Visiting Chair fee: 50 USD

Late Registration Fee will be applied after <u>September 16th</u>, <u>2022</u>: 50 USD

Fees include all supplies (i.e. notepads, pens, placards, and ID badges), lunch for all three days, transportation to and from the hotel each day of the conference, and transportation to and from the airport.

Panama's Current State and Back-Up Plan

It is important to note that although this year we are excited to plan for an in-person model, we recognize the uncertainty created by the coronavirus pandemic. Panama's cases have risen in recent weeks. While we are hopeful the situation improves in time for the conference, if for any reason, the school administration or the local authorities deem it unsafe for PANAMUN to be hosted in-person for foreign delegates and advisors, we will have an online model that can be rapidly implemented. Unfortunately, if an in-person conference is not possible, PANAMUN can only reimburse costs for food and transportation and, depending on when it happens, any other expenses affiliated with

the conference. Refunds for other costs, such as airline tickets and hotel accommodations, would need to be negotiated directly with airlines and hotels. We ask you to keep this possibility in mind, but also understand that we are optimistic about our conference being in person. We will keep you updated on Panama's situation and any changes that might be made.
